# YMCA BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP WITH DAKOTA SCHOOLS:

In order to help meet the needs of our students, parents, and community, the Dakota School District is partnering with the Family YMCA of Northwest Illinois to provide school age child care at Dakota Elementary School starting Monday, September 9<sup>th</sup>. We will still proudly be continuing the Dakota Learn & Play Center as well. The YMCA will provide additional support, but is a separate program.

The YMCA will mainly be housed in the Dakota Elementary cafeteria. The times will be Monday – Friday 6:30 am – 8:10 am & 3:10 pm – 6:00 pm. Please contact the YMCA at (815)235-2467. This program will include, homework assistance, after school snack, enrichment activities. Optional care will be provided on all early release and no school days. If the program is successful, we could expand to include summer programming in Dakota. Our hope is to meet the needs of our students, parents and community.

SCHOLARSHIPS: As soon as scholarships become available, they will be listed outside the Guidance Office, included in future newsletters, and posted on the district website. Most of the scholarships posted over the next few months will be for the national and state level. Most local scholarships don't begin arriving until the spring.

FINANCIAL AID NIGHT: There will be a financial aid night on September 16<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm for all parents who would like to learn more about the process of applying for and obtaining financial assistance for college. Specific details and help in completing the FAFSA form will also be available. In addition, Highland Community College will have reps here that night beginning at 5:30 p.m., to offer interested parents a better look at the Highland experience.

Any parent that would like to sit down one on one and discuss either the college process or the financial aid process, please feel free to contact Mr. Cline in the Guidance Office anytime to schedule an appointment.

TESTING: The following dates are reserved for special testing during the 2019-2020 school year:

October 16, 2019 - PSAT (optional Grade 11)

March 12, 2020 - PSAT 8

April 14, 2020 - SAT Grade 11 & PSAT Grades 9 & 10

ACT: Juniors or seniors wishing to take an ACT test may register for the next test at Highland Community College, Saturday, October 26th. Students must register online at <a href="www.act.org">www.act.org</a>. The cost is \$50.50 for the basic ACT or \$67.00 for ACT plus Writing. See Mrs. Ries if you have questions or need help registering. Deadline for registration without a late fee is September 20th.

**SAT Re-Takes:** Any seniors wishing to re-take their SAT at Highland Community College may register and pay at **www.sat.org/register**. Fall 2019 test dates are October 5, November 2, and December 7.

PSAT: Juniors wishing to take the optional PSAT test on October 16<sup>th</sup> need to sign-up with Mrs. Ries during the month of September. An explanation of the test will be given during U.S. History classes. The PSAT is a practice for the actual SAT test which all juniors will take this spring. This test also enters students in the prestigious National Merit Scholarship competition. Students must pay a \$15 fee on the day of the test to cover scoring costs, etc. While completely optional, this is a great opportunity for serious college-bound students to practice taking an SAT test.

SAT: All high school juniors are required to take the SAT free of charge, right here at DHS on April 14<sup>th</sup>. Our teachers will be helping students to prepare for this college entrance exam. It is recommended that students take the PSAT (mentioned above) this fall as practice.

EXPERIENCE HIGHLAND: Any seniors interested in attending Highland Community College next year may signup to attend a visit to campus on Friday, September 27<sup>th</sup>. Students will receive a campus tour and hear speakers discuss topics such as academics, registration, activities, financial aid, etc. Sign-up on the bulletin board outside the Guidance Office. This is NOT the spring registration trip to HCC. Details on that will arrive in February.

<u>IAR</u>: The state mandated IAR test will be administered to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders. Testing will be done sometime during the window of **April 14-April 24, 2020**. More specific information will follow in the months ahead.



## What should your college-bound senior be doing in the month of September?

- 1. Completing on-line applications for all colleges they are seriously considering.
- 2. Looking to attend college open house days for schools they are interested in. Most schools will have visit days on Columbus Day in particular.
- 3. Encouraging their parents to attend the financial aid night September 16<sup>th</sup>.
- 4. Signing up for the Experience Highland trip this fall if they are considering HCC.
- 5. Deciding whether or not to re-take the SAT or ACT this fall. Higher scores may help come scholarship season.

## **NURSE'S NOTES**

Just a reminder for parents of students new to Early Learning Academy (formerly PASS) as well as all K+, 6th and 9<sup>th</sup> grades, physical forms with immunization records were due the first day of school. If you have not had your child's physical done, please do so as soon as possible. Also all 12<sup>th</sup> grade students are required to have a meningitis booster/vaccination. All children must have immunizations following the current state recommendations. A parent signature is required on the physical, including the computer system generated forms. Please make sure it is signed before submitting. Children who do not have proper physical and immunization paperwork must be excluded from school after October 15<sup>th</sup> as per Illinois State Law.

Comprehensive vision exams are required for all K+ students and any new student to an Illinois school and must be submitted by the October 15<sup>th</sup> deadline as well.

Dental exams are required for all K+, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students and must be submitted by May 15, 2020. <u>This is a</u> new requirement for 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

Hearing and Vision screenings are generally done within the first few months of school. Grades included in the screenings are Pre-K-6, 8, 10, special education, and new students to the district. If your child does not fall into one of these groups and you have a concern with their hearing or vision, please call the nursing office so your child's name can be added to the screening list.

Any medication to be given at school must be submitted to the nursing office with proper paperwork as well. ALL students taking medication at school, even over the counter or emergency medications like inhalers or epi-pens, are required to fill out the proper paperwork for it to be used/carried at school.

Any new or changes in medical history for your child should be forwarded to the nursing office for their medical file. Generally when a student gets an abrasion or cut at school, it is cleaned and then an antibiotic ointment and a bandage are applied. If you do not wish your child to have this topical medication used, please notify the school nurse.

#### Fifth Grade Beginning Band

Students will make an important decision as they begin Fifth Grade....should I join the band? Joining the band will offer many opportunities for students. On August 17, 18 and 19, students were given a presentation about band and the instruments during the school day. Mouthpiece testing will ensure that your student has the proper instrument fit. We worked with each child to find the right instrument for each student based on the sound they can produce and their mouth and body structure.

Information regarding the rental of instruments and purchase of equipment and supplies needed to join band will be presented. If you have a used instrument that you would like your child to use, you should bring this to the meeting to be checked to make sure it is working properly.

Joining the band and studying music will allow students the opportunity for self expression, creativity and achievement. Music can enhance higher brain function, improve reading and math performance and provide important experiences for students. Band is also FUN! Join the Band!!!



It's your right......Do you know someone who is homeless and has children or teens needing to get to school?

#### ATTENDANCE IS IMPORTANT TO SCHOOL SUCCESS.

Homeless children have the right to:

- O Stay in their old school OR
- O Go to the school near where they are staying.
- O Immediate enrollment, even without records
- O Transportation to school, if needed.
