NURSE'S NOTES

Any children who failed the re-screening for hearing/vision have been referred for medical evaluation. I encourage you to contact your doctor right away if you have received any notification about your child failing one or both of the screenings. Good hearing and vision is essential to learning. Please make sure you bring the paperwork that has been sent home to the doctor appointment and return the referral paperwork to the nursing office.

Students who have glasses are also seen during the screening process. Some students are found to have glasses in need of repair or not wearing their prescribed glasses/contacts.

Glasses/Vision letters are sent home to inform parents.

To parents of Kindergarten, second and sixth grade students: I am still waiting on some dental forms. If your child has seen the dentist, please make sure a dental form is returned to school. If your child has not seen the dentist, please make an appointment and have it submitted before the May 15th deadline. There will be a dentist making a visit to Dakota School on 2/12 & 2/13/20. All students pre-K thru 18 years of age are able to sign up. If you would like your child to be seen, an application form must be completed and returned to school by January 10th. Some additional applications will be accepted following this date depending upon availability. Forms will be sent home with all the elementary students the first week of January upon returning from winter break. Additional forms are available in either school office and on the school website. The dentist will provide screening, cleaning, fluoride and sealants where warranted. Referrals for follow up care are done as needed.

It is the start of cold and flu season.... School illness protocol states children should be fever free without the use of fever reducer for 24 hours and also no vomiting/diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school. Please remember to check your children closely before sending them to school if they are showing signs of illness.

Guidelines For Sending Child to School:

One of the problems most often confronting parents of school-age children occurs when a child complains of not feeling well on a school day. A decision must be made as to whether the child stays home or goes to school. How do you make the right decision? You don't want to keep him home if he really isn't sick, but you also don't want to send a sick child to school. The information in this handout is not intended as medical advise, but merely a guideline to follow until you can contact your doctor for his/her opinion.

Parents: Keep this list in a convenient spot to refer to during the school year.

Every morning prior to sending your child to school please check for the following symptoms which could be contagious or indicates your child may need to see the physician.

Eyes that are red or have discharge
Coughing
Stomachache/nausea/vomiting
Diarrhea
Sore throat
Fever
Earache or discharge from ears
Rash
Any change in behavior, such as tiredness/no appetite

*If your child shows any of these symptoms, it is best to keep them home. If you are questioning any symptoms, feel free to call the nurse at 844-632-5682 to discuss it with her.

*School policy dictates that children stay home until they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication, also if your child vomits or has diarrhea within the past 24 hours, please keep him/her home from school the next day, even if your child feels better in the morning. Temperatures of 100.0 indicate dismissal home for fever. *If your child's symptoms are suspect to a contageous disease doctor confirmation is requested.

*Report absences to the school secretary by telephone by 9 a.m.

*Report communicable diseases such as strep throat, chicken pox and MRSA to the school nurse.

Dakota CUSD #201 Inclement Weather/School closings – 2019-20

Winter weather is upon us and I want to share some information on weather-related school closings so that you may be prepared for the days ahead. Student safety is always our first consideration when it comes to cancelling school or events. Typically, three physical factors impact the decision to close schools. Road conditions, temperature, and visibility are all considered when determining whether or not conditions are safe enough to have school.

Snow Days

Snow events are the most common days for school closings. Factors that are considered when deciding on whether or not to cancel school:

- Snow accumulation and drifting
- Icing
- Wind speeds (particularly for the country)
- Temperature
- Road conditions
- Forecast estimates for continued precipitation and temperature

When these conditions are impacted I will consult with township road commissioners and area superintendents. There is no single rule of thumb for accumulation amounts and much of the decision depends on the presence of blowing and/or drifting snow especially on country roads. Every effort will be made to make a decision and inform families and staff as quickly as possible.

Temperature-Related Cancellations

Extreme temperatures are often a part of our winters. Extreme temperatures impact people as well as our buses. Factors considered when making temperature-related cancellation decisions include:

- Temperature
- Wind
- Duration and Timing of Cold Temps
- Safe Operation of Buses

Our key source of data is the NOAA Wind Chill Chart

(http://www.nws.noaa.gov/om/windchill/). When inside the 30-minute exposure area of the graph, attendance is questionable and dependent upon road conditions. When wind chills are likely to be to the right of that area, it is unlikely that we would attend.

Late Starts

Late starts have often come up as a possibility for avoiding snow days. The bottom line is that we realize the level of impact that snow days have on families to find childcare and safe coverage for children. Late starts put our community in a position to have to quickly change plans mid morning and often result in more students of driving age being on the roads in already poor or unsafe conditions. We will avoid the use of late starts for these reasons.

Before/After School Events

Generally, if school is cancelled, all events and practices are cancelled. The rare occasion where this may change would involve extra-curricular tournament play at the middle or high school level if weather conditions improve throughout the day. Those situations will be communicated directly should they arise and will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Parent Role/Responsibility

Student safety is always our first priority, and we ask for your assistance by dressing students appropriately for current conditions. Please send your children to school with a coat, hat, and gloves! It always amazed me as a high school principal when I saw students coming in with no coat in below zero weather.

Also, if your child is driving, it is a great idea to equip them with an emergency kit just in case. IDOT suggests always carrying jumper cables, flares or reflectors, windshield washer fluid, an ice scraper, traction material, blankets, non-perishable food, and a first aid kit.

Please know that parents are the final authority in determining whether or not it's safe for their child to attend school during inclement weather. The Dakota School District covers over 100 square miles and road conditions can vary within different parts of the district. If parents determine to keep their child home, please contact the building office. The absence will be marked as "excused".

It is possible that on a snow day your child may have been assigned work to complete. Through the use of technology and advanced planning, many of our teachers will plan for the possibility of snow days by providing assignments or extra work should the snow day occur. Hopefully this will help you combat students that are saying... "I'm bored" all day;)

Finally, making a decision about having a snow day is a difficult one. We will use our best judgment and appreciate your support as we work to ensure student learning and student safety.

Notifications

We will always try to have a call that goes out by 6:00 am for snow days. The automated system takes about 20 minutes to complete all calls depending on the number of school closing at the same time. We will put information out on our Facebook and website immediately for instant notification. We will also notify local media.

Educational Rights of Illinois' Children & Youth in Homeless Situations

ATTENDANCE IS IMPORTANT TO SCHOOL SUCCESS.

Homeless children have the right to:

- O Stay in their old school OR
- O Go to the school near where they are staying.
- O Immediate enrollment, even without records
- O Transportation to school, if needed.
