Dear Dakota School District Students, Parents and Community Members:

It's been a great 2018-2019 school year. We appreciate the contributions of the Dakota staff, parents and the community in having it go so well. We hope everyone has a great summer!

The Dakota School Board held its regular May board meeting on the 21st. Below is a summary of the meeting.

Recognized Sue Gallagher (retiring board secretary)

Long time Dakota Board Secretary, Sue Gallagher, was recognized for her exceptional service to the district. Sue has served as the Board Secretary since December of 2000. She has also served as the superintendent's secretary during this time. Comments were made both by administrators and board members for her commitment to the district, positive impact and meaningful support. Sue is retiring at the end of June, but this was her final board meeting.

Recognized Diane Lawson for earning Illinois Principal (IPA) Northwest Region Leadership Award

Jeff Milburn, elementary principal, presented elementary secretary, Diane Lawson, a certificate for earning the Northwest Region Leadership Award. Diane has been serving the district as the elementary secretary for 33 years and has made a significant contribution to the school environment at Dakota Elementary.

Principal Reports

Dakota Elementary principal Jeff Milburn reported on the following items:

- Sixth graders Cassie Boyer and Aidan Meier were recognized at the Illinois Principal Association (IPA) Leadership Brunch
- PTO sponsored a luncheon for Teacher Appreciation Week
- ° End of year MAPS assessment results and growth

Dakota JH/HS principal Jason Grey reported on the following:

- The 8th graders scored well above national and state averages on the Preliminary Student Achievement Test (PSAT) in reading, writing and mathematics.
- Sophomore Cali Minkie competed in the 400 meter dash at the IHSA state track meet in Charleston, IL.
- ° Five Dakota High School boys qualified for the IHSA state meet this week in Charleston: Cade Kloster, Josh Clark, Nolan Lentz, Kaleb Morris and Jordan Ayres.
- Softball ended their season with a record of 22-6 and tied for conference championship.
- Baseball won the IHSA regional tournament held at Dakota by defeating Freeport Aquin 3-2. They will compete in the sectional tournament at Le-Win on Thursday.
- OHeld a parent meeting for the 2019-2020 athletic season. The meeting reviewed the summer program and requirements for the 2019-2020 season. Parents were also able to meet with coaches to review expectations and prepare paperwork.

Adopted updated board policies

The board approved the most current issue of policy recommendations from the Illinois Association of School Boards. Many of the adoptions reflect changes in school code or the impact of recent court cases. There were a couple of new policies which addressed retirement severance payment for educational support staff and behavioral threat assessment.

Approved bid for sealing parking lots and repairing elementary playground blacktop.

The board approved a bid from Premier Sealcoating not to exceed \$131,431 to seal, paint and repair the district parking lots and to replace the elementary playground blacktop.

Approved final 2018-2019 school calendar

As a requirement of all Illinois schools, the final calendar must be submitted to the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE). The final calendar reflects five emergency days (snow days) and four Act of God (AOG) days beyond the five emergency days.

Reviewed and finalized board committee assignments and scheduled committee meetings for Monday, June 10th beginning at 5:30 p.m.

The board reviewed the responsibilities of the Planning and Development Committee and the Monitoring and External Communications Committee and finalized the committee assignments. Planning and Development: Colette Binger, Tom Liszka, Eric Stiegler and Jesse Milks. Monitoring and External Communications: Karen Kleckner, Carie Panoske, and HeiDee Meier. The first committee meetings are scheduled for Monday, June 10.

Reviewed registration fees and lunch prices for 2019-2020.

Mr. Prusator and Mr. Mathers shared that their recommendation is to not increase registration or lunch fees for the 2019-2020 school year. They plan to make final recommendation at the June meeting.

Reviewed tentative 2019-2020 calendar

Mr. Mathers briefly reviewed the tentative calendar for next

Reviewed raising daily substitute teacher rate beginning in 2019-2020

Mr. Prusator shared area substitute teacher daily rates and shared that Dakota has fallen behind area rates. Based on the current survey information, Mr. Prusator suggested the board should consider increasing the rate from \$75 per day to \$85.

- Cathy Korwin & Charity Rhode approved as junior high summer school teachers.
- Employed Aleda Lee, Alexis Rote, Paiton Jones, Logan Siemens, Chase Descheemaker, Abby Cline, Riley Jones & Jacob Kleckner as student workers for summer painting/mowing. Laura Henze, Michelle Brashaw and Deb Brinkmeier were approved as summer custodial help and painting.

nurse's notes

Dental forms are required for K, 2nd and 6th grades and must be submitted by May 15 or final report cards will be held. <u>For the 2019-2020 school year and beyond, all 9th graders will also be required to submit the dental exam form.</u>

Just a reminder for parents of students entering: Pre-K for the first time (Early Childhood/PASS/Dakota Daycare or Nursery School); and K, 6th and 9th grades in the fall: **Physical forms** are required! New students to the district must have an Illinois physical if moving from out of state regardless of grade. Forms may be picked up at any of the school offices. Sports physicals are not sufficient. All children must have on file a record of having received the inoculations to prevent communicable diseases, which are mandated by state law. Completed physicals may be turned in now but are requested by registration. State law requires that students be excluded from school after October 15th, if the proper form is not on file.

Illinois immunization requirements dictate students 6th thru 9th must have Tdap, and 6th and 12th graders must have Meningococcal Vaccine.

The state also requires all K students and all new students to an Illinois school to have a **vision exam**. This is to be turned in at time of the physical.

Medications and inhalers, etc. belonging to students will be sent home the final day of school with the students. Please look for them when your child gets home. If your child will not be in school the last day please contact the nursing office to make arrangements to get your child's medication. Turn in new medication administration forms, signed by both parent and physician, during registration if medication will be needed next school year. These forms can also be picked up in the school offices.

Health History updates: If your child has any surgery, medical problems, etc. during the summer, please notify the nurse so their health records may be updated. This includes changes in physicians and medication. Medical history forms should be turned in for each new student, including incoming kindergarten students.

Reminder for parents without any health insurance coverage: The Stephenson Co. Health Dept. offers services for low-income families to obtain sick/well child services for children from birth to 18 years of age. For more information they can be reached at 815-235-8271

Dear Parents,

Reading at home is so important to your child's academic development. Your child works hard all year and it is vital to maintain their growth over the summer. Your child can avoid the "summer slide" by reading for <u>at least 30 minutes</u> every day. In order to help with this, we encourage participation in the DES Summer Reading program!

Participation is simple: record your child's reading time on the attached log. The logs are set up just like the reading log your child brought home this school year. 15 minutes = 1 step/row. That's it! Use our website: www.dakotasummerreading.weebly.com to stay updated on dates/times, and find notes, printables, contact information, etc.

We understand that it can be hard to encourage reading over the summer. As a way to make reading more fun, we hope you get involved in the following activities and incentives:

- DES Library The elementary library will be open on Tuesdays from 8am-noon starting on June 4, and going through August 6. All elementary students already have a library account, but we can start new accounts for incoming students and community members. We will be having read-alouds on the hour each week. Check the website for read-aloud themes or time updates.
- **Bookmobile** Back by popular demand is our *library on wheels* the Bookmobile! The Bookmobile will be making stops in Lancaster Heights, Dakota, Rock Grove, Rock City, Davis, and Lake Summerset. See the schedule on the other side of this note, or on the website.
- New! Reading Punch Cards As your child completes a reading activity on the card, initial/sign the box. Bring the punch card anytime you visit the DES Library, Bookmobile, or the Summer Reading Party because a finished set of 5 boxes earns a prize! There is one reading punch card attached to your child's reading log that aligns with his/her age. However, there are other options to choose from! You can pick them up at the library or Bookmobile, or you can print punch cards from our Summer Reading website:

- Summer Reading Party Logging any amount of reading minutes over the summer is all students need to do to be able to join our Summer Reading party! This party will take place on the evening of Thursday, August 8th. Students and their families are invited to come enjoy ice cream and a movie.
- Summer Reading School Sleepover Back by popular demand is our School Sleepover!
 Students who log 40 hours of reading this summer will be able to stay after the ice cream and movie party for a school sleepover! We will play games, run around with glow sticks and flashlights, eat snacks, and stay up until the wee hours! (Read for about 35 minutes a day to meet this goal!)

Frequently Asked Questions...

Can my child still participate in this program without visiting the library or Bookmobile?

YES! You don't have to use library books! Kids can read any books they want- just remember to keep track of their <u>time</u> spent reading. Magazines and informational texts such as articles or manuals also count.



Where can we get books besides the library and Bookmobile?

Read your own books from home, find books at garage sales, Voices, Goodwill and Salvation Army, swap with a friend, borrow from your neighbor...books are EVERYWHERE!!!

Does it count on the reading log if someone reads to my child?

Yes! Reading and listening to stories are both important skills! If someone reads to your child, you can include that on their reading log. If your child and their friend or sibling take turns reading back and forth, that whole time spent together reading counts on your child's log and on the other person's log too! Audiobooks are another great way for your child to listen to reading.

What if we lose or damage the reading log?

You can PREVENT losing/damaging the log by keeping it in a safe place at all times. Good places to keep reading logs: a bulletin board, the fridge, a certain spot on the counter. Extra logs are available in the library, Bookmobile and in the elementary office, on the website, or we can send you a new one. Keep track of their reading minutes on another piece of paper until you can get a new log.

I don't know what books to recommend to my child, where can I get help?

Talk to other kids to see what they like to read or ask any teacher for recommendations. Or - get online! There are tons of book recommendation websites out there, try googling your child's age and gender ("books for nine year old boys"). There are also book lists and recommendations on scholastic.com/kids.

My child doesn't like/want to read books. What can I do to get him/her to read?

Any kind of reading counts. Magazines, articles, instructions, pamphlets, following along with an audiobook, or reading interactive books on websites such as Bookflix are all examples of reading options other than books.

Educational Rights of Illinois' Children & Youth in Homeless Situations

It's your right......Do you know someone who is homeless and has children or teens needing to get to school?

ATTENDANCE IS IMPORTANT TO SCHOOL SUCCESS.

Homeless children have the right to:

- O Stay in their old school OR
- O Go to the school near where they are staying.
- O Immediate enrollment, even without records
- O Transportation to school, if needed.
