The Dakota School Board conducted its regular March board meeting on Tuesday, March 19th. Below are some highlights from the meeting.

Student Recognition

Administrative Reports

Principal Reports

Dakota Elementary principal Jeff Milburn reported on the following items:

- ❖ Orton-Gillingham training (reading) for staff scheduled for March 18-19.
- ❖ ARC training (reading) for staff scheduled for March 21.
- ❖ The Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) state assessment will be administered in March
- ❖ Kindergarten registration was held on March 7th.

Dakota JH/HS principal Jason Grey reported on the following:

- ❖ 8th grade students took the PSAT for the first time as part of the SAT preparation plan. Freshmen, sophomores and juniors will take the PSAT on April 9th.
- ❖ The Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR, state assessment), will be administered on April 17th and 18th.
- ❖ Placement testing for college dual credit has been completed. It is expected that the high school will have over 20 students enrolled in college English/psychology next school year.
- ❖ 35 students are currently registered for CareerTec programs for the next school year.
- ❖ Pete Alber is a nominee for the IWCOA Wrestling Coach of the Year, while Kevin Cline is nominated for the IBCA District 10 Coach of the Year.
- ❖ Annie, the Musical is scheduled for April 4, 5, and 6 in the Dakota High School.

Reviewed 2018-2019 Keep Dakota Proud! Plan.

The Board reviewed the 2018-2019 Keep Dakota Proud! Plan which acts as the district's improvement plan. Mr. Prusator shared that some of the uncompleted initiatives will likely be included in the 2019-2020 plan.

Approved updated board policies on display

The board approved updates to board policies. Most of the updates are in response to changes in legislation. The recommendations are provided by the Illinois Association of School Board's (IASB) policy department.

Reviewed draft of 2019-2020 Keep Dakota Proud! Plan

Similar to the February meeting, Mr. Prusator reviewed the 2019-2020 draft of the KDPP. The plan includes initiatives for consideration for next year. At this point items are being added to the list with the board planning to make a final approval for the plan at the April or May board meeting.

Rescheduled regular April meeting and scheduled organizational meeting

Due to the April 2nd school board election and vote canvassing timelines, the board voted to reschedule the regular April meeting from April 16th to Tuesday, April 23rd. The board will also conduct its organizational meeting by seating new board members and electing officers.

Approved expanding extra-curricular activities to include bowling

In order to provide greater access to extra-curricular activities the Board approved the addition of a bowling team for boys and girls beginning with the 2019-2020 school year.

Approved sale of excess baseball uniform inventory to public

The board approved the release of old baseball uniforms for sale to the public. The uniforms are currently in storage with no plans of being needed for use. The proceeds will go to support the high school baseball activity account.

Approved administrative cost cap waiver hearing for the April 23rd board meeting.

Due to the changes in the way the superintendent position has been staffed over the past three years and the increased allotment of days and per diem for the current year, the expenditures in budgeted administrative expense line items are 5% greater than last year. Consequently, the district will file a waiver with the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE). A hearing is required prior to submitting the waiver. The hearing will be held prior to the April board meeting.

Approved cooperative hockey agreement with Monroe High School

The Board approved the cooperative hockey agreement with Monroe High School. This cooperative agreement has been in place for the past two years.

Our students take federally required assessments every spring. These assessments help us understand how our students are growing academically compared to their peers across the state. Students will be utilizing their chromebooks or the computer lab for these assessments. You can ensure your child does his/her best by helping in the following areas:

- Making sure your child attends school on testing days.
- Make sure your child gets a good night's rest.
- Making sure your child eats breakfast each morning.
- Encourage your child to ask questions about the test directions if unsure.
- Encourage your child NOT to worry about this assessment.
- Encourage your child to do their best, sharing your confidence in their ability.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Kindergarten registration for the 2019-2020 year was held in March. If you were unable to attend, please call the elementary office at 844-632-5682 or stop in the elementary office to complete the registration papers. To register, you will need two forms of address verification, the child's certified birth certificate & any legal paperwork (custody) that pertains to the child.

PRESCHOOL SCREENING

Dakota preschool screening will be held April 11th & 12th @ the elementary school. Appointments can be made online @ www.dakota201.org and click on preschool screening. We invite all children who live in the Dakota district aged 2 ½ - 5 years to participate. The results of these screenings will be used to determine eligibility in the preschool programs at Dakota for the 2019-20 school year. A major portion of a child's learning takes place during the preschool years and it is important to identify problems as early in a child's life as possible. We hope that you take advantage of the opportunity and schedule an appointment.

NURSE'S NOTES

Students in K, 2nd and 6th are required to submit proof of having seen the dentist by May 15. A dental exam record can be obtained from your dentist and must be dated within 18 months of the deadline. Many families still have not forwarded this information to the nursing office and final report cards will be held as per state guidelines until it is received.

Just a reminder that school physicals are required for Pre-K, K, 6th and 9th grades as well as new students to the district regardless of grade placement, showing proof of a school physical and immunizations. For the upcoming school year it may be easier to get into the doctor if you plan it early in the summer. Forms can be dropped off to the school offices anytime but are requested by registration week. If your child will need medication next school year remember to ask the doctor to complete the medication authorization forms while you are there. All students using emergency medications such as inhalers, insulin or epi-pens are required to submit some medication authorization even if they are self-administering. Please contact the nursing office for instructions.

SAT TESTING:

All juniors will be taking their state mandated SAT exam here at DHS on **Tuesday, April 9th**. Testing will begin at 8:10 a.m. and will conclude at approximately 1:00 p.m. *With a signed permission form, juniors may be dismissed from school at that time.* There will be no CareerTEC for juniors on this day. Freshman and sophomores will also be taking a PSAT exam on this day from 8:10 until 11:30. *They will NOT be dismissed following their exam.*

HIGHLAND REGISTRATION:

Dakota High School and Highland Community College will continue in a partnership to register students for the fall semester. On **Tuesday, April 16th**, we will be busing all students who are committed to attending Highland to the Freeport campus where they will take their placement exams, meet with an advisor, register on-line for courses and receive a campus tour. A sign-up sheet will be posted after spring break with a deadline of April 8th. More specific details and instructions will follow. Educational Rights of Illinois' Children & Youth in Homeless Situations

It's your right.....Do you know someone who is homeless and has children or teens needing to get to school?

ATTENDANCE IS IMPORTANT TO SCHOOL SUCCESS.

Homeless children have the right to:

- Stay in their old school OR
- Go to the school near where they are staying.
- Immediate enrollment, even without records
- Transportation to school, if needed.
