November was a wonderful month in the Library and Literacy Garden!

Our students were busy readers! In November, the Elementary Library checked out 1,755 books, and the High School checked out 254 books. Way to go, Dakota readers!

During read-alouds, we explored the branches of the Armed Forces in honor of Veterans Day. Students shared stories of family members who served and even their own aspirations to see the world. We also highlighted kindness as part of districtwide Kindness Week and enjoyed fall-themed books about agriculture. Before Thanksgiving break, we read the Caldecott-winning Balloons Over Broadway by Melissa Sweet, which inspired our fourth graders and their reading buddies to create their own hallway "balloon parade."

AR progress continues to rise!

This quarter, we focused on helping students match book choices to their interests and their i-Ready Lexile levels.

The results have been impressive: last quarter, 83 elementary students met their AR goal; already this quarter, 72 students have met theirs—including 12 who have doubled their goals.

Students can now take AR quizzes until 7 p.m. and on weekends, which has made it easier for busy families to participate.

We look forward to celebrating even more student success as we near the end of the second quarter. It's exciting to see so many children developing a true love of reading!

A quick reminder about book checkout:

Library books may be kept for two weeks and renewed if needed. Students can typically check out two to four books depending on grade level.

If a student has more than two overdue books, we ask that those be returned before borrowing more.

Overdue slips may be sent home, and books more than a month overdue may be considered lost and subject to a replacement fee. Thank you for helping us keep books circulating for all students.


