



The media center and literacy garden are busy places at the heart of our school district. In the first month of school, we have already checked out 2,283 books! Way to go Dakota readers! September was a busy month! We participated in "Start with Hello" week to help students build connections, prevent social isolation, and create safer, more inclusive schools. Students learned and perfected their "Hello Style" and found the upstanders among themselves while identifying trusted adults throughout our building. We also had a wonderful guest speaker named Kimberly Sigafus. Kim is the CEO of Quiet Souls Events and Education, a local non-profit that promotes native culture through educational programs. She is an American Indian with the Ojibwa tribe and a local author. She visited the library and presented to the 5th grade class as they learned about Native American Indians. The student's finished project diorama's will be on display beginning on Friday September 26th. Be sure to stop in and check them out!
