Welcome to the Title I Reading and Math Program

Title I is a federally funded program designed to supplement classroom reading and math instruction. Students are selected based on state and district-wide assessments. Students meet daily in small, flexible groups for a minimum of 30 minutes of instruction and up to 60 minutes.

Our Focus

Title I teachers, in cooperation with classroom teachers, provide instruction to meet the specific needs of each student. Materials and methods are selected to teach the following critical skills:

- Phonological Awareness
- Phonics
- Fluency
- Vocabulary
- Comprehension Literature and Informational Text
- Numbers and Opperations
- Algebra and Algebraic Thinking
- Measurement & Data
- Geometry

Monitoring each student's progress allows the teachers to continually reevaluate the success of targeted instruction for flexible grouping.

Students qualify for this program according to their reading and math scores on standardized assessments and classroom teacher recommendations. Some of the assessments used at Dakota Elementary School include:
